Market Bulletin for Quarters 3 and 4, 2019

Fruits for quarter 3, 2019

Fruit sales for Q3 and Q4:

Q3: Tomatoes, and Watermelons were the dominant fruits reported in this quarter with over three hundred plants harvested for home consumption and sale. New crops that appeared in the market were Courgette or Zucchini, Lime and Pawpaws.

Q4: Similar to quarter 3, Watermelon and Tomatoes dominated the market with Capsicum, Eggplant and Corn appearing for the first time on the market.

Watermelon was sold in singles at an average reduced price of ten dollars in this quarter. Tomatoes continued to be sold at an average price of five dollars per bag.

Root Crop sales for Q3 and Q4:

Q3: Maniota was the main root crop reported in this quarter with total plants harvested of almost six hundred and eighty. These were sold in bags at an average price of twelve dollars for three kilogram bags. Carrots appeared on the market with a selling price of four dollars a bag.

Q4: Ginger, Maniota, Kumara and Tarua were the crops harvested in this quarter. Kumara was the only root crop sold in the market at an average price of fifteen dollars a kilo. The other crops harvested were basically for home consumption or for visiting families and friends.

The table illustrates the proportion of land use utilized for agriculture purposes on the Island of Mauke in the third and fourth quarters of 2019. It shows an increase of over thirty percent for land usage for all crop types from the third to the fourth quarter.

Livestock

Chicken is the most common livestock on Mauke with a total count of one thousand two hundred and eighty five, followed by pigs and goats.

<u>Note</u>: Data collected are for livestock being well managed by farmers.
