Root Crops, Fruits & Vegetables

Maniota, Taro and Tarua were the root crops harvested for this quarter, however, due to the festive season and family gatherings, these root crops were kept for home consumption and was not made available for sale.

Fruits such as Bananas, cucumber, tomatoes, watermelons, passionfruit were also grown but again, kept for home consumption rather than for sale.


Land use

70% of the land utilized for agricultural purposes was used for the planting of root crops and the remaining areas used for the planting of vegetables.

Livestock

Pigs, goats and cattle were the only livestock reported for this period on the island of Atiu. Pigs comprised more than 69% of the livestock reported, followed by goats and cattle. It is believed that there are other livestock (chicken and ducks) on the island, however, this was not reported.
