Vegetables

Land use

An increase in the use of land for planting root cops and tree crops were noted for this quarter. Farmers preparing the land for replanting of root crops for the local market and possible exports were the key reasons for the increment.

Marcotting and pruning training provided by the Ministry further encouraged farmers to increase their involvement in tree crop planting.

Livestock

Pigs, chickens and goats were the only livestock reported by the farmers for this quarter. Chicken continues to be most kept livestock (52%) on the island with a total number of eight hundred reported for this quarter. This was followed pigs and goats with a total of 534 and 207 numbers reported respectively.

<u>Note:</u> Livestock data collected are only for those being well managed by farmers.
