Market Bulletin for Quarter 3, 2021

Fruits

Tomatoes and Capsicum were the only fruits reported during the survey that are supplied to the market and the local stores with a total weight of over 240 kilograms. In addition, a further 872 kg of assorted fruits were exported to the Rarotonga market. Produce exported was capsicum, tomato, eggplant, snake beans and cucumber.

Root Crops

Taro, yam and maniota appeared on the market this quarter, with kumara showing some increase in its supply from the previous quarter. A total of 726 kg of Taro and 288 kg of yam were also harvested this quarter and exported to the Rarotonga market together with 35 kg of ginger.

Vegetables

No vegetables were reported via the AgINTEL data collection for this quarter, but data from exportation shows that 455 kg of cabbages, lettuce, silver beet and broccoli were air freighted to the Rarotonga market.

Land Use

Noted this quarter was an increase in the land-use under root crops by almost three acres when compared to the previous quarter. On the contrary, land-use under tree crops and those under vegetable crops declined by one and two acres respectively, compared to the previous quarter. This indicates that fewer growers opted to plant fruits and vegetables during this quarter.

Livestock

Pigs, goats, local chicken and ducks were the only livestock reported by the farmers surveyed in this quarter. Pigs were the most kept livestock on the island with 454 reported. The number of pigs, goats and ducks showed increases in this quarter when compared to the previous quarter by 21, 81 and 30 respectively. Note that livestock data collected were only for those being well managed by the farmers.
