

DECEMBER QUARTER 2023

Root Crops Sales



Taro and Maniota remains the most consistently supplied root crop on the market with Kumara significantly appearing on the market this quarter and expected to increase in the coming months. Taro averaged over a ton in the last two months of the quarter and Maniota averaged over 400kgs. Other promising root crops harvested this quarter and reported in small quantities were Tarotarua, Tumeric, white and red Radish, Carrot and Ginger. Maniota is also noted as a valued added product sold in the form of grated, pudding (poke), plate of food enhancement and home consumption.

Fruits Sales




Figure 2 shows fruits over the accumulated threshold of 100kgs reported during this quarter. Other tropical fruits harvested in smaller quantities appearing on the market and roadside stalls are Sweet corn, Breadfruit, Soursop, Okra, Zucchini, Mangoes, Bitter melon, Passionfruit, Lemon, Apple Star, Lime, Tamarind, Mandarin,


Dragonfruit and Jackfruit. Tomatoes and Pawpaws both supplied over 4 tons each to the market this quarter, averaging over a ton each month. Watermelon, Drinking Nut, Cucumber, Pineapples and Bananas all harvested over a ton each. Watermelon and Pineapples all showed significant increases by 95% and 54% throughout the three months.

Vegetables Sales



All vegetables showed monthly reductions with Cabbages averaging over 580kgs, Pak Choi averaging over 350kgs and Rukau (Taro tops) supplying 280kgs. The reduction can be contributed to our dry weather over that period. Other vegetables harvested and reported in small quantities this quarter were Spinach, Brocolli, Cauliflower, Spring Onion and Silverbeet.
